- ▶ LHV H&POA Board Members Attend the Meetings of Ouray County Road & Bridge Committee
- ▶ Brought the Pot Holes On Ponderosa to Their Attention
- ▶ County Fixed the Pot Holes on Ponderosa and Also Checked the Rest of the Paved Roads and Fixed a Couple Others
- May Be a Ballot Issue Coming Up to Increase Funding For Road & Bridge
- Steven Calkins, R&B Superintendent, and His Staff Are Doing A Great Job With the Limited Resources They Have Available

Fire Mitigation

- Creating Defensible Space
 - ▶ Zone 1 30′ from your home
 - ► Clear all combustibles & trees
 - ► Grasses no taller than 6 inches
 - ▶ Zone 2 30′ to 100′ from your home
 - ► Thin trees to 10' crown separation
 - If you are on a steep slope, you may need to increase the above defensible space guidelines by 50% or more on the downhill side
 - ▶ Wooden decks are extremely combustible
 - Store firewood outside Zone 1

West Region Wildfire Council

- Grants to Assist with Fire Mitigation
- ► Contact WRWC and Set Up a Site Evaluation
- ▶ They Will Arrange for a Site Visit By:
 - ▶ WRWC fire mitigation specialist
 - ▶ Austin Shelby, Ranger with Colorado State
- ► Site Visit Will Consider Several Factors
 - Acreage
 - Terrain
 - Density

West Region Wildfire Council

- ► After Consulting With the Landowner, Austin Will Write a Prescription
- ▶ WRWC Will Help With the Grant Application
- ► Grant Funding Is Based On Several Factors
- ► Maximum Is Usually 75%
- ▶ Be Aware, This Process Does Take Some Time

Dallas Creek Water Company

- Can Dallas Creek Dry Up?
 - Dallas Creek has never gone dry
 - ▶ DCWC Has Senior Rights dating back to 1879, 1880 & 1885
 - ▶ Even in driest years such as 2002
 - ▶ Never had to place a call on junior rights
 - ▶ Senior water rights have never been called by down stream users
 - Current storage can supply 100 gpd to users for 39 days of emergency service
 - ▶ DWCA Has Made a Lot of Infrastructure Improvements to Reduce the System Leakage from 50% Water Loss to a Small Amount.
 - ▶ About the equivalent of a single water hose across the whole system

DCWC Backup Plan

- Connection Between Dallas Creek Water Co. and Tri-counties Water
- ► Estimated Cost Of \$340,000
- ▶ DCWC and TCW Are Applying For a Grant to Cover 50% of Cost
- Remaining Cost Split Between DCWC and TCW; But Split Is TBD
- ▶ Target Winter of 2019 2020 for Construction
- Ultimately, DCWC Water Users Will Have to Pay for the DWCA Additional Costs Thru Higher Rates

ACC Report

- ► Conducted Final Approval on Four New Homes
- ▶ Issued Pre-Approval for Construction of Four New Homes
- ► Conducted Final Reviews on:
 - ▶ 1 home addition
 - 2 garages
 - ▶ 1 greenhouse
- ► Also Approved Several Minor Projects
 - ▶ Fence
 - ▶ Tree thinning
 - Decks

- ► Continued Efforts to Control Mullen in the Elk Run Meadows
- ▶ Acquired Two Parcels At No Cost Other Than Registration Paperwork
 - ► Located in Unit IV
 - Will not develop the parcel accessed from CR 24
 - ▶ Built new trail named Lupine Trail at the end of Pine Dr

Mail Kiosk Lighting

- Current Lights are Weak
 - ▶ On all the time when it is dark, so it runs down the batteries
 - ▶ Solar panels are shaded in the summer so the lights don't work
- ▶ Possible Solution Would Be 3 New Solar Lights With Motion Sensors
 - ▶ Place the solar panels so they get sunlight year round
 - ▶ Motion sensor so they don't run down the batteries needlessly
- ▶ Motion Made and Approved to Rework the Mail Kiosk Lighting
